ST. PAUL, Minnesota. May 1, 2019 – The new Minnesota Teacher of the Year will be named this Sunday, May 5. The Saint Paul RiverCentre hosts this year's Teacher of the Year banquet.

Kelly D. Holstine, the current Minnesota Teacher of the Year, will announce her successor at the banquet. This is the 55th year for the program. Minnesota has produced four National Teachers of the Year, more than any state except Washington and California.



The banquet takes place from 1-3 p.m. in Ballrooms C and D on the second floor of the Saint Paul RiverCentre. The surprise announcement of the new Teacher of the Year should take place between 2:30 p.m. and 3 p.m. In addition, the announcement will be broadcast live on Facebook on the Minnesota Teacher of the Year Facebook page.
