In this session, participants will learn more about the effects of ACEs and trauma-informed education as well as gain resources to further their understanding of ACEs and how to make personal connections with students dealing with them. The case study of REACH Stewartville will be shared. **REACH Stewartville is making positive** connections with students through Relationships, Education, Accountability, Character, and Hard work (REACH). Session resources focus on assisting

schools in making personal connections, providing character education, resilience building, understanding the effects of ACEs, and building a culture of giving and empathy for others.
