It Time To Start Thinking About The November Election

Yes, it is time to start talking politics and the November mid-term election. If you remember, prior to the 2018 mid-term election you heard from local leaders and Education Minnesota staff about the 33,000 drop off voters in the 2014 midterm election. The ask at that time was to get to the polls. Well, this year the message is the same. We encourage, ask, and

need all members of Education Minnesota to vote. Please take the time to research the candidates and their positions on public education. I ask you to support candidates that support public education, but most of all, just vote. Current Governor Tim Walz has been endorsed by Education Minnesota. Soon Education Minnesota members will be screening and endorsing other candidates running for political office. Please be ready for communications that will come from our office regarding the need for members to help screen candidates. Screening will most likely take place in late May and June, after the legislative session has come to a close.

It is never too early for you to identify and engage fellow members to get involved in the political process. We are looking for volunteers from ALL our locals to work on "get out the vote" campaigns. We need your help in engaging your local members to vote. As mentioned earlier, Education Minnesota will continue to endorse candidates, but the focus this year will be to get all members to the polls. If you would like to be on your local team to help make this happen, please let me know.

Another way to get involved is to participate in the Political Refund Contribution Program. This program allows any resident of Minnesota to make a contribution to any candidate and be reimbursed up to \$50.00 for singles and \$100.00 for married couples. This is a great way to support a candidate of your choosing and get involved in the political process.</u>

Education Minnesota would also like to know if there are any local levy campaigns or school board races your local would like supported. We can help you in the process of passing a levy or endorsing various school board candidates. Please do not hesitate to let me know if you have any such local races. We want to help.

We continually hear, Elections Matter. Well, it is true. It is time to think about the future. A few days ago, I attended the Kramer-Brown IO Recognition Dinner. During this event the K-B IO recognized IO Leaders, Local Presidents, Local Teachers of the Year, Friends of Education, and last, but certainly not least, retirees. On my drive home after the event, I thought about how hard it is going to be to replace all the retirees that were in the room and those that were not able to attend. Of those attending, there were at least 3, maybe 4 with 40 plus years of experience, with most others having 30-35 plus years of experience. How does one replace a teacher like Carol Rhen from G-MR. Carol has taught for 40 plus years, in a wide variety of subject areas. From LOW, Don Krause is

retiring after many years in the classroom, as a coach, and taking students on overseas trips. Retiring from Goodridge, are Eric Mickelson and Alice Sather. Two individuals with long, respected careers in education. From RLCC, Dawn Halvorson and Penni Nelson are both retiring after many years in the District. Attending from TRF was elementary teacher Denise Nelson. We heard how the newer teachers see Denise as a mentor, providing so much encouragement and support to new teachers in the District. From Warroad, attending was Lori Schaible, a long time elementary teacher in Warroad. We heard how these people were not only teachers, but mentors, coaches, advisors, union leaders/advocates, and leaders in their communities. How do you replace these people? The answer is, you just don't. The hope is we can attract new people to the profession that can eventually step up to fill the large wholes these people leave behind. But, there is a problem. Like it or not, politics rule our public education world. There is a move in this country to underfund and undermine public education. We need to step up, become involved and not let this happen. How? By voting in all elections. We need to make sure the voice of public education is heard. We need to take an active role in the political process. Please get involved. The most important thing you can do is vote. That may seem like common sense, but we cannot afford to have Education Minnesota members not vote in the upcoming November election. Getting good results from elections is one of the most important things your union does to ensure that public education thrives in Minnesota. The real work of getting education friendly candidates elected comes from engaging ALL of you. It is time to stand up for public education. Once the information is available, I will be sending local leaders the information to share with all members. The most important thing you can do is get involved. Whether you make a financial contribution to a candidate, volunteer to help a candidate's campaign or help at an Education Minnesota sponsored event, getting involved is not difficult at all.

Education Minnesota can help you in the process of passing a levy or endorsing various school board candidates. Please do not hesitate to let me know if you have any such local races. Loan forgiveness training available

Education Minnesota's Degrees, Not Debt program now has an online training available on the expansion of loan forgiveness options and the steps educators have to do in order to take advantage of this program.

Educators can access the training on the free professional development platform, MEA Online. Search the catalog for "Degrees Not Debt."

By taking the training, those wanting support for loan forgiveness questions will have a solid foundation to understand options and from which to ask questions.

In general, an educator's ability to access and/or apply for forgiveness is going to be dependent on a number of factors. There are a few options for loan forgiveness out there, but each come with a different set of eligibility standards, which is why Education Minnesota suggests taking the online training to start the process.

Once the training is complete and you have found your federal loan information on studentaid.gov, Education Minnesota staff can help guide you throughout the whole process.




