Budget forecast review

If you didn't hear yesterday, the Minnesota Management and Budget Office released the February budget forecast, which provides the roadmap to how much state legislators would be able to invest in solutions this year.

The forecast came back positive, with a stronger surplus than was reported in November. This is good news, but we still have folks crunching the numbers to identify how much of the surplus is counted as **ongoing** money. To make systemic change, like improvements toward our pensions, we need ongoing money. We'll have more updates as more information comes in.

Following the forecast news, legislative leaders will be releasing their budget targets for this session. Budget targets set the amount of money intended to go to each legislative policy area. LCPR Chair Rep. Kaohly Vang Her mentioned at our rally that she's fighting for a budget target with ongoing money to improve teacher pensions.

Now is the most important time to use this <u>easy call-to-action email</u> to contact legislative leadership about our needs.
