The House is back! Here's where we are

The state Capitol is roaring back to life after a slow start to the 2025 legislative session.

Republicans control the House for the time being (a March 11 special election may change that again), while the DFL returned to power in the Senate following a special election in that chamber.

What does all this mean for pension reform?

Due to big backlog at the Revisor's Office, we're still waiting on our pension bill to be introduced and no meetings of the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement have yet been scheduled.

We do have pension bill authors (Rep. Dan Wolgamott and Sen. Heather Gustafson), and the legislation will contain our Pension Advisory Group's recommendations approved by the governing board:

- Create an unreduced career rule of 60 years of age and 30 years of service, rewarding decades of public service with a fair retirement benefit that will help retain mid-career educators.
- Reduce penalties for educators ages 59-64 from 7% to 5%, so educators can choose when they're ready to retire without losing a significant amount of their pension benefit.
- Remove the delay on cost-of-living-adjustments for Tier 2 educators who
 retire before their Normal Retirement Age and immediately increase
 COLAs for retirees from 1.2% to 1.5%.

Once our bill is introduced, watch for a specific call to action and other ways to get involved!
