

Minnesota Senate budget plan honors funding promises, but falls short on pensions

The Minnesota Senate released the first details of its plan for the state budget today, and while it delivers on promised increases to E-12 education, it doesn't provide enough money for improving teacher pensions.

"The staffing shortage across the state means too many students are trying to learn in overcrowded classrooms and the workload is burning out educators at an alarming rate," said Education Minnesota President Denise Specht. "The state must address this crisis head-on by investing in increased pay, pensions, and health care for all educators so districts can recruit and retain staff. The Senate plans to spend only \$45 million for all public sector pensions, not just for teachers. This is inadequate and unacceptable. This issue is too important for the Legislature to delay any longer."

These targets are only the first step in the budget process. Education Minnesota will continue to push legislative leadership to fund improvements to pensions for Minnesota's hardworking teachers in the final state budget.

Agendas are usually finalized the week before, so we will confirm then.
